




# Tuesday September 13 11:30-1:00

# Youth Ministry Joins the Guatemala Mission Team

This summer, in place of our normal youth mission trip, we decided to gather as the intergenerational body of Christ as we learn about and learn from our brothers and sisters in Guatemala. Four high school students and eight adults joined us as we learned from our friends at CEDEPCA, including Betsey Moe, and as we reconnected with our friends and partners at La Libertad school.







### INTERGENERATIONAL GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP

#### Guatemala Mission Team

It was a joy to return to Guatemala after two years of postponing trips. Our team of twelve was welcomed by our ministry partners at The Protestant Center for Pastoral Studies in Central America (CEDEPCA), including Rev. Betsey Moe. CEDEPCA staff members helped us learn about their four areas of focus: women's (and men's) ministry, biblical and theological education, disaster ministry, and intercultural encounters.

Prior to the trip, our group expressed interest in learning about education in Guatemala. Our CEDEPCA facilitators created an itinerary that would allow us to pursue our interest. The itinerary also helped us to further strengthen our partnership with the La Libertad school in Coban and the La Puerta Abierta Learning Program. We began with a visit to the Francisco Coll School in Guatemala City. The school primarily serves families who reside in the largest garbage dump in Central America. We were able to provide school supplies for classrooms and visit with students, teachers, and the principal. We then met with Edgar Chen, a government Minister of Education before we spent the next day at the La Libertad school. Students and teachers greeted us with creative presentations of their favorite books and aspects of Guatemalan culture. Through these presentations, we witnessed the teachers' passion and dedication to their work. We distributed books for classroom libraries and heard testimonies from the teacher training provided by La Puerta Abierta. During recess we spent time with students in a variety of ways, including: playing soccer, coloring, making paper airplanes, a science lesson with Joe Bruce, and taking photos. True delight marked this time as it was the first opportunity students had to play outside together since the pandemic. Visits to two of the students' homes helped us learn more about the ways our partnership with La Libertad impacted children and families.

We concluded our trip with the Moe family, learning about their experiences transitioning to life in Guatemala. While hiking up a volcano and sharing delicious meals together, we were able to reflect on what we learned during our week.

Words cannot express the gratitude of the Guatemala team for the generosity of HPPC. Your prayers and financial gifts blessed our experience in innumerable ways.
