Help Fund Deacons Neighborhood Outreach Projects

As Deacons of Neighborhood Outreach, we would like to explain that this program is donation driven. There is no set budget. Therefore, the many ways we support Hamblen Elementary, Liberty Park Community Development Center, Bite2Go, and Adams Elementary are dependent on your willingness to give.

As we begin this school year, we have already purchased school supplies for both Hamblen and Adams. Items they have requested include paper, scissors, markers, crayons, binders, and clothing/underwear for 'accidents'. This does not cover all the requests but is our 'drop in the bucket' from Hamblen Presbyterian.

Bite2Go begins in September and runs throughout the entire school year at a cost of \$400 or \$500 per month for the 20 students we help sponsor at Hamblen. As we move into winter, we will provide gift cards to Hamblen & Adams at Christmas time and help organize/purchase toys for the 'Toy Store' at Liberty Park. In the spring, we purchase shirts and shorts for the Preschool at Liberty Park.

There are times we are asked if we can do more... It all depends on the funds we have. We are asking you to consider helping us build up the Neighborhood Outreach Fund by generously donating. Your gifts can be designated to go toward Bite2Go specifically or the general Neighborhood Outreach Fund.






Summer Camp

GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP 2023

Changing Children's Lives in Guatemala

On August 19, a team of seven representing Hamblen Park Presbyterian departed for Guatemala. We traveled by bus from Guatemala City to Coban. In Coban, we spent a day with the teachers and staff at Escuela La Libertad, the elementary school where we sponsor the Libros Abiertos Project.



The students and teachers had prepared a welcome program for us, followed by a tour of every classroom. They were all very excited and proud to show us what they have learned through reading. We brought them new books and school supplies.

Our emphasis this visit was on space and flight. Joe Bruce brought a telescope and the students could view the sun. He also taught everyone about eclipses. We brought other activities for the students, featuring space and flight.

We also visited schools in Chicoj and Limon Sur, a rural school and a remote school with five classrooms. The students gave demonstrations and we shared activities. These were three joyful days, celebrating reading and learning.

In addition, we were privileged to meet with a group of pastors representing PresGOV and a group of pastors from the Chisec Presbytery. They shared with us their faith, joy, frustrations, and hopes for the future.

The Director of Education for the Coban School District and 25 other interested educators met with us in Coban. They made a formal request to expand the Libros Abiertos Project in their schools. This meeting left us feeling challenged and inspired in equal measure.

The team returned to Spokane impressed and encouraged by the results we've seen from the Libros Abiertos Project and the efforts of the teachers and students. We are now in a period of discernment and planning for the future. Thank you for all your generous and joyful support of this project, one that is changing children's lives for the better.
